ANNUAL CORPORATE MEMBERSHIPS SUPPORT:

RESEARCH into cancers that disproportionately impact marginalized communities, focusing on underlying biological and societal factors that drive inequity. Funds raised each year will support a range of research projects that advance equity in prevention and treatment.



COMMUNITY EDUCATION on screening and prevention, provided in English or Spanish. Topics include breast cancer awareness, healthy lifestyles and nutrition, men's health, and community resources.

About George Edgecomb

Moffitt Health Equity Partners is an outgrowth of Moffitt's George Edgecomb Society. The group was founded in honor of Hillsborough County's first African American judge and a good friend of



H. Lee Moffitt, founder of the cancer center. In 1977, at just 33 years old, Edgecomb died of leukemia. The George Edgecomb Society honors Judge Edgecomb's life and impact by seeking to address the systemic barriers that prevent our communities from achieving health equity.

Did You Know

Black/African American men and women have a 210% and 41% higher risk of dying from prostate cancer and breast cancer, respectively, compared with their white counterparts.



Hispanic adolescents are 38% more likely to develop leukemia than non-Hispanice white adolescents.

Asian/Pacific Islander adults are twice as

likely to DIE from stomach cancer as white adults.



American Indian/Alaska Native adults are

twice as likely

to DEVELOP liver and bile duct cancer as white adults.

Health Disparities

are differences in outcomes linked to social, economic or environmental disadvantages. They are a direct result of systemic inequities and exclusion of individuals based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, abilities, or other defining characteristics historically linked to discrimination.



Health Equity

is the guiding principle underlying a commitment to address the systemic causes that lead to health disparities in marginalized communities. When we pursue health equity, we are striving for the highest possible standard of health for ALL people by focusing additional resources on the specific needs of those at greatest risk of poor health.
