NEEDS ASSESSMENT Head and neck cancer is a devastating disease that significantly affects patients' quality of life. Recurrent/metastatic disease often has a poor prognosis. Recent advancements in the knowledge of molecular biology and behavior of head and neck cancers has allowed for new treatment paradigms to emerge.
